Randy shared the Ohio Revised Code Section 4511.215 Local authorization for operation of low-speed, under-speed or utility vehicle, or mini-truck. He also shared that Roaming Shores a great Ordinance in Place.
3. Camping in the village was discussed and we need a legislation in place. A few ordinances from neighboring areas were shared to give us an idea of how it is being handled in other areas.

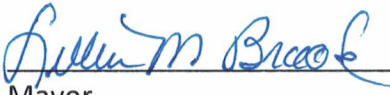
UNFINISHED BUSINESS.
